The City Council of the City of Cameron met in Regular Session November 16, 2020, from the Benedum Community Building. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Councilperson Sherry Johnson moved to approve the minutes as presented on November 2, 2020 meeting, seconded by Councilperson Terri Galentine. Motion carried, vote of 5 l'S. Mayor polled each councilperson individually for all voted items listed under November 16, 2020 Council Minutes.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

- Sharon Roupe entered conference Via Phone Call to discuss the building she owns on 166 Main Street Cameron, WV. Miss Roupe had her sons tie the wall back. Miss. Roupe and her sons plan to fix up the building. They have been in the process of getting quotes for a roof to be put on building. Each councilperson spoke and asked Miss Roupe questions regarding building.
 - Councilperson Joe Wendt With the shape of the building he would like to see it tore down.
 - Councilperson Kenny Richmond Feels this building is a safety issue and needs tore down.
 - Councilperson Terri Galentine Questioned Miss Roupe what she has in place if the building would fall?
 - Councilperson PZ Winters Building in question has been an ongoing issue for years. Would like to see building tore down.

After reviewing quote council voted on Approval of the double door installed with hardware and single door installed with hardware to be completed now. Councilperson PZ Winters moved to approve, seconded by Terri Galentine. Motion carried, vote of 5 l's.

 Cameron Recreational Park – Larry Hartley and other electricians continuing to work on lighting. Light has been placed to light up flagpole. Christian Turak is also going to reach out to Steve about blacktop.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS:

1) On December 7, 2020 the second public meeting will be held at Benedum Building Council Chambers at 6:30 P.M. The meeting is to obtain input from citizens regarding community development, possible PHASE III WATER PROJECT. Will also add to the Agenda Discussion and Approval for Mayor to sign the application.

2) Mayor is in the process of seeking PHASE IIII funding thru DEP Funds and IJDC Funds. These funds would be ALL FORGIVING FUNDS. The Mayor is working with Sewer Board, Sewer Plant Operator, Thrasher LLC, and Belomar. Application will be submitted for approval or denial. 3) Q & M Construction has removed the home located at 52 High Street. Also removing debris from trailer next to the said property. Price for removal was \$5,000.00.

4) Mayor has spoke with Chief of Police, Mike Dougherty about police officers going out to assist with EMS when a call is received for inside city limits. If the police officer is not currently dealing with something else at that given time.
